



PRODUCT LOSS ANALYSIS

POLICY SUGGESTION

Determined our suggestion based on the analysis of lost inventory and ethics





The food bank has the responsibility of keeping members satisfied with what they receive, and catering to proper ethics in minimizing food disposal. A change in the distribution policy from 12 months past the best-before-date to 8 months has the potential to satisfy members while maintaining minimal food disposal.
