

LOWER MEDIAN INCOME

of \$13,691 annually compared to approximately \$48,000 for the whole city [2]



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To continue Ray-Cam Co-operative Centre's ongoing efforts to address food insecurity in the OUR AIM: DTES community of Vancouver by establishing a Farm-to-Family program.

Why Farm₂Family?

BUILDING COMMUNITY

- utilizes strengths of the community [5]
- encourages internal dialogue + engagement
- increases community autonomy in preparing and eating healthy food



• surplus produce can be put to use, rather than being disposed

IMPROVING COMMUNITY FOOD SECURITY

- provides fresh + nutritious produce that is often inadequately provided by donation-based services
- *"maximizes healthy choices,"* community self-reliance and equal access for everyone" [4]
