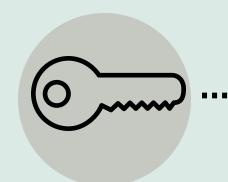

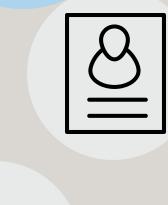

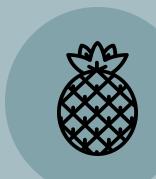

What We Found



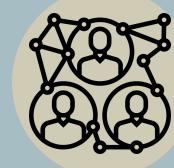
There are very few organizations that provide similar services as **GFFA** in East Vancouver



7/10 high schools have food and snack programs to address food insecurity in youth



Frequency, times and types of food organizations are offering their youth during their snack programs

East Vancouver Neighbourhood Houses offered food programs for youth



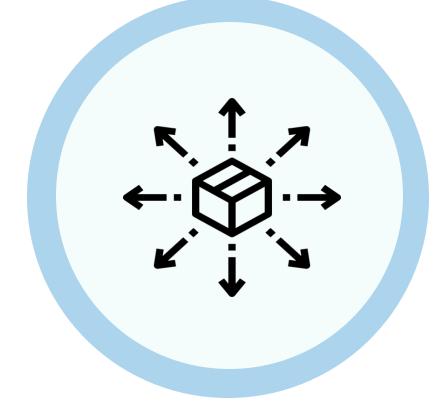
Some organizations with free snack programs buy food from dollars stores due to lack of funding
