
OBJECTIVE

 Identify food categories by weight


DID YOU KNOW ...²

Approximately 58% of all food produced is lost or wasted worldwide.

In 2018 alone, the Richmond Food Bank recovered 410,000 kg of food (which is equivalent to 682,000 meals served)!


