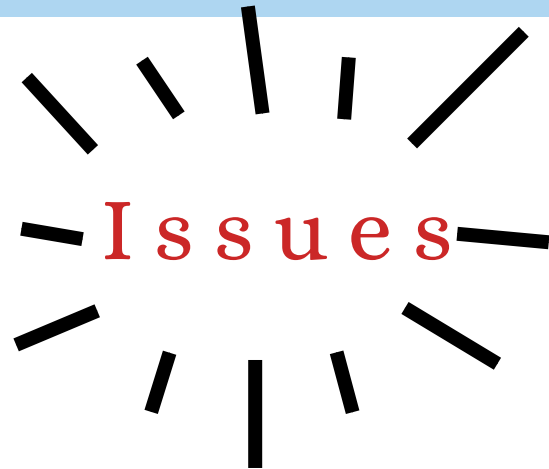

"Community food security is defined as a situation in which all community residents obtain an affordable, safe, culturally acceptable, nutritionally adequate diet through a sustainable food system" [2].

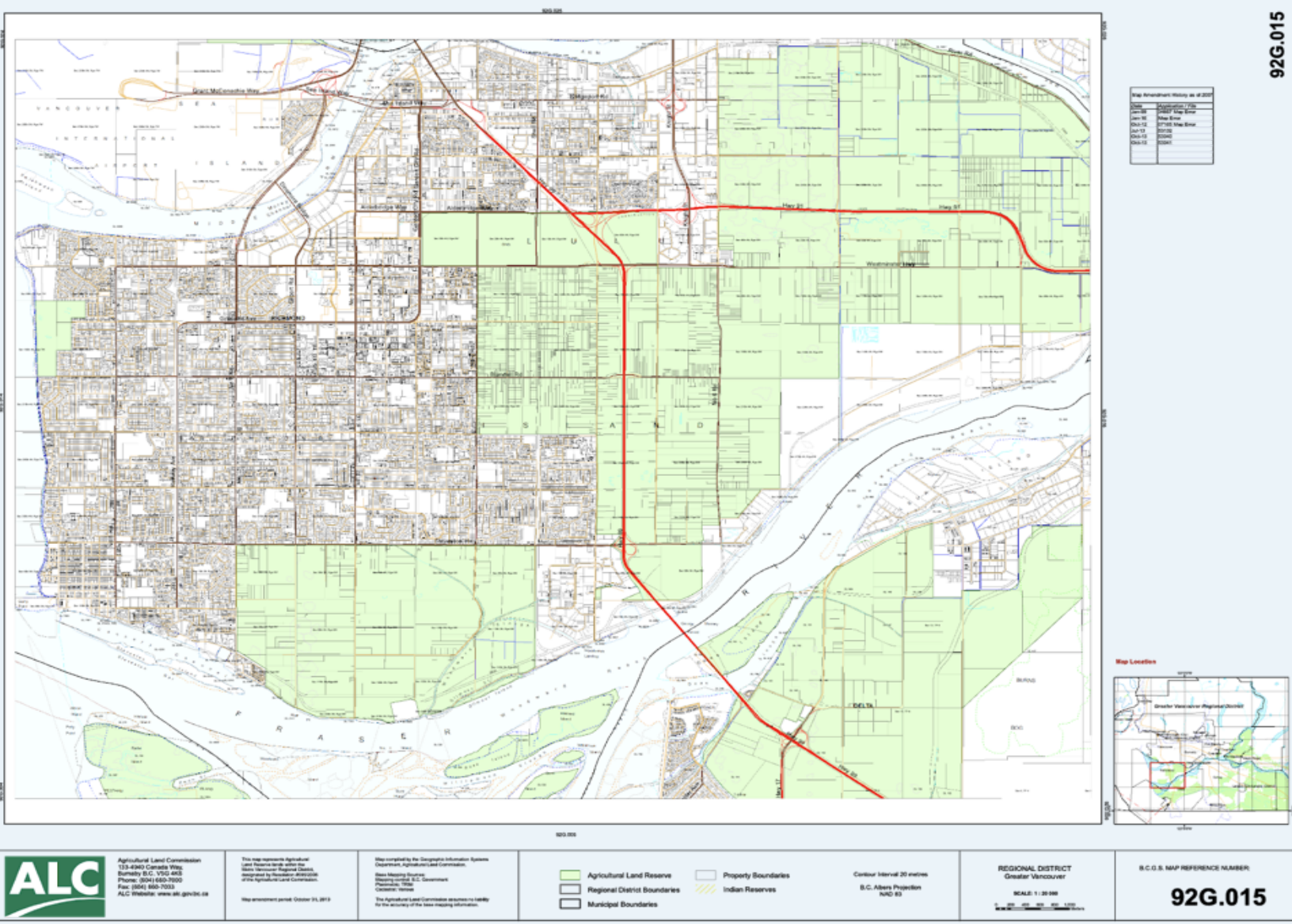

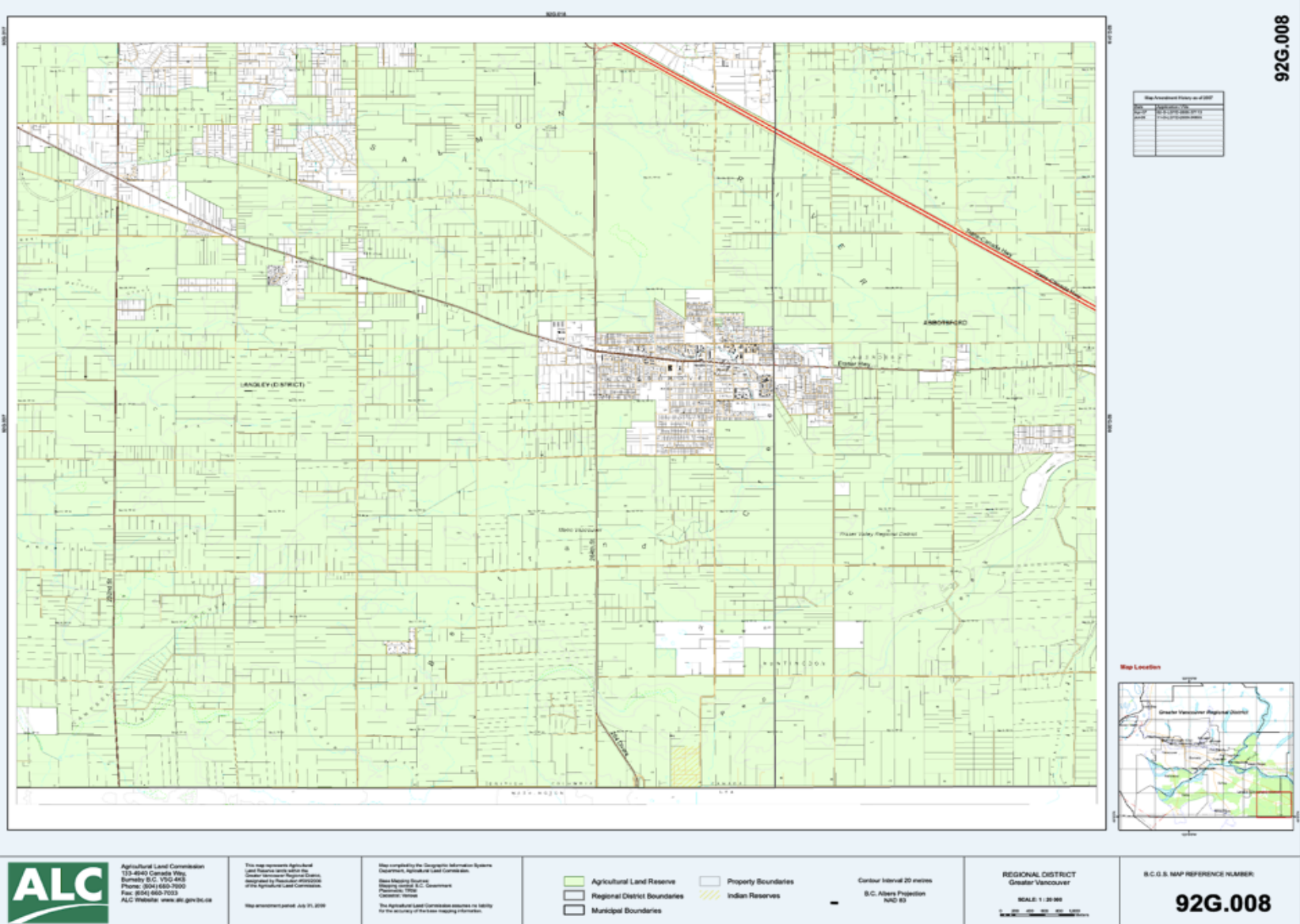
